CALIFORNIA UNIVERSITY SCHOOL OF LAW, FOUNDED IN 1928, SERVES ONE OF THE NATION'S MOST VIBRANT REGIONAL ECONOMIES. CU's nine-story building houses several research centers, state headquarters for the Small Business Development Center; the Center for International Business Education and Research, business libraries, and executive education facilities. The university enrolls more than 36,000 students.

As the nation's fourth-largest corporate center and home to several Fortune 500 companies, San Francisco is alive with two major professional sports teams, a variety of museums, parks, and everything else you would expect in a thriving city.

California University is situated in the North Beach section of the city, a charming and colorful area with a mixture of shops and businesses. It is a lively place for graduate students and is considered one of the most cultural areas of the city. It is home to world-famous museums and is just minutes

away from the San Francisco Symphony Orchestra, the San Francisco Public Theater, and the San Francisco Ballet Theater—all located downtown. Also lending uniqueness to San Francisco is that both of its major sports teams—the San Francisco Giants and the San Francisco 49ers—have been world champions.

In addition to maintaining a culturally unique disposition, California University's student body reflects 31 percent underrepresented minorities (representing 18 countries) and a 60:40 male-female ratio. LLM students will also complete some coursework at the California University School of Law. The Law School offers candidates a full range of law courses, seminars, and skills development classes, and a state-of-the-art law library, making California University's LLM Program one of the most challenging and academically diverse of its kind in the entire nation.
