COSTS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

The LLM program is one of the most affordable in the world—the total cost of tuition fees and other fees is less than \$23,000. All candidates may apply for generous financial assistance, including full scholarships (tuition fees and non-resident fees waiver) or partial scholarships (non-resident fees waiver only, cutting education costs in half). Help is also available to apply for private loans. San Francisco's high-end cost of living can be made more manageable by adhering to a strict budget and utilizing the law school's ample travel and housing amenities.

THE CITY

San Francisco, one of the United States' most culturally diverse cities, is a lively city on the San Francisco Bay. With a metropolitan-area population of close to 1 million people, San Francisco has something to offer to every LLM student. Clean and well-run, it is known for its many ethnic and music festivals, as well as a wide variety of fresh seafood and various cultural cuisines.

To earn the LLM degree, students will be required to complete a minimum of 22 credit hours during a nine-month period of academic residence at the California University School of Law.

PROGRAM DETAILS

A maximum of five LLM students will be enrolled per academic year. LLM students take the same courses as JD students and must complete an LLM Research Project on an international or comparative sports law topic.

COURSES

The Law School offers candidates a full range of law courses, seminars, and skills development classes, especially in the business, transactional, corporate, and commercial law areas that are often important to international lawyers.
