

I am currently the Senior Director of Employment Services at St. Patrick Center where we provide employment assistance and other support services to individuals with barriers to employment. Most of our clients are homeless, many have substance abuse or mental health issues or both, approximately 50 percent have a criminal record and equally as many have less than a high school diploma.
